PI-02/23/05 Neighbourhood Plan.

Planning Policy and Strategy Manager, Eddie West of Shropshire Council gave a presentation on the pros and cons of Neighbourhood Plans. Mr West stated that Shropshire Council would have a supporting role should the council wish to create a plan but would not write it. To set up a plan would mean setting up a steering group from the community and employing a planning consultant.

Rosie Corner Ellesmere's Place Plan Officer from Shropshire Council went through Neighbourhood Plan grant funding process and explained that the current funding is coming to an end in March 2023, it is not currently whether there will be any future funding available.

Members were informed that the benefit to creating a Neighbourhood Plan would be that the Town Council would have more control. The plan would give us more statutory power over controlling designated Green Space and Development sites and would shape how the community develops.

Emerging local plan up to 2038, a plan would allow infrastructure need to be identified, currently Ellesmere is building 25 houses on average per year.

It was also asked if CIL money could be used to fund creating a plan, it was confirmed that it could not be used.

Members felt that the hedge should remain and that a fence should also be placed behind it to stop small children and pets escaping from the rear boundary.

RESOLVED - Support the change to variation 17.

FURTHER RESOLVED - Object to condition 16 to save the hedge and ask developers to also install a fence behind it.
