# PI-04/23/05 Neighbourhood Plan.

(a) Members discussed Neighbourhood Plans following Eddie West's presentation on 6th February 2023 with varied views. It was felt that Council could benefit in that could have more of a say when it came to the decision making. Councillors did agree that they would like to talk to another council that had completed the process. It was moved by Cllr G Hutchinson, seconded by Cllr A Wignall and

RESOLVED: that Cllr Elner contact local Councils of a similar size to ask about their experiences of creating a Neighbourhood Plan.

# (b) Neighbourhood Grant Funding.

The Clerk confirmed that an email had been received from Rosie Corner of Shropshire Council confirming that the Grant fund has now been extended to £10,000. **Noted.**

# Highways & Parking issues in Ellesmere.

(a) Members considered a request from Ellesmere Primary School to support the change of the speed limit outside the school. They also asked for a pedestrian crossing at the end of Cambria Avenue and school signs setting the speed limit to a 20-mile limit all along the front of the school. Cllr G Elner acknowledged that he had also received the request as a Shropshire Councillor. Cllr G Elner had spoken with Shropshire Council, who stated that there is a scheme in place with some funding available, but had no further details at this time.

Cllr G Elner had also discussed with the school safety officer the potential of making the bus stop in Trimpley Street, (just past the crossing, where the path is wide, into a layby) allowing buses dropping off children to pull in allowing traffic to continually flow. Both the school and bus company confirmed that they would be in favour if funding could be found.

(b & c) Members discussed parking & highways issues throughout the town. Following a discussion, it was agreed for the committee to write a highways plan street by street detailing the issues and possible solutions, then invite a Highways Officer and Portfolio Holder from Highways to a meeting to hear the councils' concerns. In addition, it was agreed to invite a Shropshire Council Planning and Enforcement Officer to a meeting for advice on how to encourage residents to support anti-social parking within the town. It was further agreed to write to Shropshire Council to see if a residents parking area could be created on Birch Road.

The faulty traffic lights on Scotland Street were mentioned, and it was confirmed that they are reported every week. Cllr Elner requested that the Admin Assistant inform him of the number of times the traffic lights had been reported.

RESOLVED: for the Committee to create a street-by-street plan of Highways concerns and solutions and then invite a Highways Officer and Highways Portfolio Holder to a meeting.

FURTHER RESOLVED: to invite a Parking Enforcement Officer to a meeting. FURTHER RESOLVED: write to Shropshire Council to request a residents parking area and scheme be created and implemented on Birch Road.
